### Hyraxes or Dassies (Hyracoidea)

Species (5):		Red List status (2016)
<i>Dendrohyrax arboreus</i>	Southern tree hyrax	Least Concern
<i>Dendrohyrax dorsalis</i>	Western tree hyrax	Least Concern
<i>Dendrohyrax validus</i>	Eastern tree hyrax	Near Threatened
<i>Heterohyrax brucei</i>	Yellow-spotted hyrax	Least Concern
<i>Procavia capensis</i>	Rock hyrax	Least Concern

<b>Main threats and pressures:</b>	Habitat loss (especially forests in eastern and western Africa)
	Exploitation for meat and fur
	Human-wildlife conflict (killed to reduce damage to gardens and crops)
	Predation by introduced red fox
	Sport hunting in northern Africa (mainly by the armed forces)

Main Actions	Details/Locations	Estimated cost (US\$) 2016 - 2020
Develop standardized monitoring protocols for hyrax to track trends over time and produce more data for Red List assessments.	Develop monitoring protocols	US\$ 30,000
Conduct surveys to determine distribution and abundance, combined with a genetic study to facilitate taxonomic revision and to verify species diversity.	Range wide, but priorities include: Dahomey Gap Islands on the East African coast Genetic analyses	US\$ 500,000 US\$ 100,000
